

A new program for personalized medicine program supported by the Guy Lafleur Fund



Cardiometabolic diseases

A state of the art microscope

Thanks to your support, the CRCHUM's teams were able to acquire a high speed cellular imaging device. This cutting edge microscope takes ultra high quality pictures and video, giving researchers better insight into how cells, for example cardiac cells, behave and act. With a traditional microscope, researchers are limited to hundreds of tests a day, but this new technology makes it possible to do tens of thousands of tests in that time.





Immunopathology

Keeping our researchers safe

With your support, the CRCHUM's research teams were able to acquire additional biosafety cabinets (BSCs).

These enclosed spaces trap infectious aerosols and particles when handling living cells and tissue. Unlike standard lab fume hoods, BSCs protect not only medical personnel but also their samples and the entire lab environment. This is especially important for people like our immunopathology professionals, who work every day with samples of viruses and other infectious materials.

"BSCs are fundamental equipment for ensuring that our teams and the specimens they study remain safe and sterile. They create a barrier between the user and their sample, greatly reducing the risk of contamination."

Neuroscience

Supporting young scientists and attracting the best minds from all over the world



Every year, your support helps the CHUM and its research centre pass on their unique knowledgeand expertise, giving young medical professionals high quality research so they can offer the very best care to thousands of patients across Quebec.

This year, thanks to you, 26 researchers received start up grants to quickly establish cutting edge research programs and generate preliminary data that will give them access to subsidies. One recipient is Élie Bou-Assi, Ph.D., who is studying how to predict epileptic seizures, a condition that affects over 50 million people worldwide.

"Overnight, I began suffering from constant epileptic seizures. I was one of the 25% of people with epilepsy who are resistant to treatment. At the CHUM, I was able to benefit from a new surgical treatment method. I haven't had a seizure since."

Mental health

A mental health program for pregnant and postpartum mothers



Dr. Andréanne Wassef is one of the hundreds of professionals working on initiatives to assist people suffering from mental health issues.

This year, your donations helped Dr. Wassef establish an assistance program for women experiencing mental health issues during or after their pregnancy. This program aims to raise awareness of perinatal mental health issues and develop research projects to better understand what these women are going through so they can receive proper care.

"Like many women, I was very worried early in my pregnancy about the changes that awaited me. It got so bad that I was paralyzed with anxiety. That's when I was diagnosed with perinatal depression and immediately referred to Dr. Andréanne Wassef. That appointment saved my life."
