Thanks to you, we gave the CHUM and its research centre **\$15,194,245** for the health of Quebecers this year. That's a 30% increase from last year!

On top of celebrating a quarter of a century, our foundation publicly launched its first major campaign since the new CHUM was built: **Act faster than disease**. The campaign's goal is to raise \$200 million by 2028, and we've got a great team helping us get there. In addition to the campaign's co chairs, Pascal Tremblay and Maxime Ménard, we have 23 volunteers from the business community who have stepped up to join forces with us as part of the cabinet. We are extremely grateful to them, and we know that together, we will reach our goal of helping the CHUM's teams get a head start on beating disease.

This year also featured important work to secure the future of health philanthropy, including Bill 15, adopted in December. Negotiations with the MSSS and Minister Dubé's office were conducted in close collaboration with CEOs of other large hospital foundations. We spoke with one voice to

express the philanthropic community's desire to preserve foundations' independence and respect donors' wishes regarding the use of their gifts. We are proud to report that we were heard. Your choices about how the CHUM Foundation uses your donations will continue to be respected.

As we begin 2024–2025, we're full of enthusiasm. We are expecting a number of new commitments and major gifts in the coming years. These unprecedentedly generous promises will support the CHUM's teams in their ability to develop precision medicine and launch multiple research and teaching projects.

- Transformational initiatives, like the CHUM's School of Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare launched by the Direction de l'enseignement et de l'Académie (DEAC)
- Grant programs

This fund provides sustainable support for the CHUM's talented teams and the patients they care for—all thanks to your unwavering support.



Exceptional care

Advancing adaptive, high-precision and safer radiation therapy

Thanks to you, the CHUM had access to **\$2 million** to help purchase the MRI-Linac.

This revolutionary technology uses high-performance imaging and artificial intelligence to track tumours in real time and accurately deliver radiation treatment. The anticipated benefits are incredibly exciting: better controlled cancer, fewer side effects and fewer treatment sessions.

The CHUM is one of the first two hospitals in Quebec to purchase an MRI-Linac, thereby strengthening its role as a leader in personalized cancer care and treatment.



Precision dialysis technology

Driven by the CHUM's nephrology and hemodialysis department's ambition to improve prognosis and care for its patients, the TECHNO-HDF program explores how new technology can predict and prevent the risk of complications for patients on a hemodialysis protocol. To make this initiative a reality, the support of Chhay Heang Ly and his family helped purchase a device used to obtain important information about a patient's body composition, along with an ultrasound device.

Chhay Heang Ly and his family have also donated grants to train three nurses in dialysis each year so they can build their skills in more advanced care.



Improving patient well-being every day

Your support constantly helps the CHUM's medical team solidify their expertise and develop their skills—and it also helps them focus on the person behind the patient.

Here are just some of the projects you have made possible for promoting patient well-being:

Groundbreaking research projects

A next-generation vaccine to beat cancer

Through a substantial **\$1 million** pledge from the Gosselin family foundation, the CHUM is about to gain access to a new, revolutionary, personalized oncology treatment approach.


This research initiative is bringing hope to thousands of people and will come to life through technological synergy between the CRCHUM's Cancer team and Franco-Canadian company ANGANY Inc.

The immunotherapy tools developed by ANGANY are opening the door to cancer treatments that use vaccines to target each patient's individual mutations.

“Two out of five Canadians develop cancer during their lifetime, and one out of four Canadians is expected to die from cancer.

Taking care of women's heart during postnatal

February 26, 2024, marked the start of a first-of-its-kind partnership between the CHUM's centre of expertise in women's cardiovascular health, Cardio F, and 15 pharmacist owners affiliated with Pharmaprix. This innovative partnership, linked to a **\$100,000** contribution from Shoppers Foundation for Women's Health, gave rise to a research project to assess the effectiveness and impact of a new model for closely monitoring some 100 women through a virtual clinic.

The goal?

- To prevent and treat risks related to cardiovascular pregnancy complications.

Personalized medicine to stop neurodegeneration in its tracks

Progressive supranuclear palsy (PSP) is a rare disease that is often mistaken for Alzheimer's or Parkinson's disease and affects nearly 1,000 people in Quebec.

Right now, it has no cure, and death usually ensues within five years of diagnosis. A **\$500,000** donation from the Fondation Edward Peter Gallagher et Nicole Leclerc is being used to support research to identify the biological characteristics of PSP to prevent neurodegeneration, diagnose the disease sooner, monitor the progression of the disease and identify innovative, personalized treatment approaches.

"The CHUM is the first recognized CurePSP Center of Care outside the United States. Our research focuses on the malfunction of the tau protein, which is involved in the development of both PSP and Alzheimer's disease.

As we investigate PSP and profile patients, we're discovering information that's key to better understanding PSP and applying it to Alzheimer's as well. And for that, philanthropy and impactful donations are essential to fast-track our progress."

Learning more about childhood epilepsy

Childhood epilepsy, including Lennox-Gastaut syndrome, is often the most severe and fatal type of epilepsy and does not respond well to anti-seizure treatments. To discover new, tailored cures and reduce disabilities associated with this type of epilepsy, we need to learn more about what's behind it. A donation of nearly **\$1.5 million** from the Fondation Mirella et Lino Saputo launched two research projects led by Dr. Éric Samarut.

"Personalized medicine is one of the most promising tools giving hope to patients who have no clear genetic diagnosis and no appropriate or available treatments right now.

The work we're doing in our labs is to try to understand and unravel the genetic causes of rare epilepsy syndromes. This helps us find new treatment approaches and gain a better understanding of what the genetic causes of the disease may have to do with the patient's response to treatment."




Supporting knowledge sharing



Visionary Circle




Jonathan Drouin golf tournament ● **\$840,095**




